DEPARTMENT 2 – POULTRY/FOWL, RABBITS & DOGS

1. A cock is defined as a male over one year; a hen is defined as a female over one year; a cockerel is defined as a male less than one year; a pullet is defined as a female less than one year.
2. Exhibitors must provide feed and water, and be responsible for feed and care at all times. (Cages must be kept clean.) The Management accepts no responsibility. Premiums will be forfeited if animals are not cared for.
3. No person, except those authorized, will be permitted to handle any birds except their own.

DIVISION B - RABBITS

RULES:

1. Breeds will be judged closely following ARBA Standards of Perfection.
2. All rabbits must have a permanent tattoo in the left ear.
3. Cross breeds judged separately from purebreds and judged as meat animal only.
4. A meat pen consists of 3 rabbits, preferably of the same breed and variety. A meat pen does not have to come from the same litter. Rabbits must be over 3 pounds and under 5 pounds each. All rabbits must be weighed in the presence of the judge.
5. Best of Breed and Best Opposite will be selected in each breed class.
6. To enter, use entry form in the fair book. Remember, each exhibitor may receive only one prize money in each class.
7. Any disqualified rabbits will not receive a placing.

2. Proof of approved effective (at the time of Fair) vaccination of the dog for rabies is required.
