

BEEF ULTRASOUND CONTEST:

What: The Livestock Sale Committee and Eastern Colorado Veterinary Services are going to be offering ultrasounds on market beef projects for interested members.

Why: *The ultrasound scan is designed to give members some data information about their animal. Data collected from the ultrasound can be used to *estimate* carcass retail yield and meat quality. Common traits estimated include ribeye area, backfat, intramuscular, and rump fat.

*Help youth learn more about the commercial cattle market and how traits and carcass information impact value received from buyers and packers as well as what the industry standards are regarding consumers consumption habits.

When: <u>Friday, August 13</u> (9:00am-12:00pm). *Members can rotate in around the round robin competition.

Cost: \$20/Head

To Participate:

- 1) Simply Sign up Tuesday at weigh-in on the sheet which market beef animals (tag #'s) you would like scanned. *Breeding Beef may also get an ultrasound (you must provide appropriate association information if you want information sent off).
- 2) Provide Payment *Checks payable to Lincoln County Livestock Sale Committee (LCLSC) or bring exact change on Tuesday at Weigh-IN.

PORTABLE SCALE & FAIRGROUND SCALES AVAILABLE FOR USE:

- There is a portable (sheep, goat, and swine) scale available for use at the Extension Office. The scale is available for use/pickup on a first-come basis by appointment only during office hours. We encourage you to bring a trailer to load it into.
- *A \$50 deposit is required and an equipment check-out sheet must be completed. *Cash or check-as we do not have a credit card machine.
- *The scale must be disinfected according to the "Disinfectant Protocol Sheet" before it is returned to the office.
- *A \$50 late fee will apply if the scale is not returned on time.
- *Non 4-H/FFA members may also rent the scale for \$25/ per day.
- The scales at the fairgrounds to weigh cattle and other species are also available for use this summer by appointment only during office hours.



ANIMAL CORNER:



BIOSECURITY-LIVESTOCK SHOWS

Before Events:

- -Ensure required vaccinations are current.
- -Check state requirements for brand and health inspection requirements.
- -Create a traveling folder to store brand and health papers, pictures of livestock, and contact information including your local veterinarian and state contacts.
- -Clean and disinfect trailers, equipment, and tack.
- -Examine animals for any signs of illness or disease and take their temperature.
- -Take clean clothes and shoes so as not to spread contaminants from your place to others.

At Events:

- -Tie animals on opposite sides of the trailer from neighbors.
- -Use solid barriers or keep an empty stall between livestock.
- -Avoid nose to nose contact with other animals.
- -Limit access from the public and dogs.
- -Do not share equipment or feed.
- -Do not use community water tanks and avoid contact on the bucket with the end of the hose.
- -Properly dispose of manure and trash.
- -Utilize insect repellants.

After Events:

- -Disinfect all equipment, tack, and trailers.
- -Keep manure and trash disposal away from animals after returning home.
- -Isolate returning animals to home property for a minimum of 14 days.
- -Take animals temperature and monitor for illness.
- -Create and update a log of all events attended including: locations stopped at; date; and contact information in case of a disease outbreak.
- -Wash all clothing and shoes from the event before working with home animals.

INVITING BUYERS TO THE LIVESTOCK SALE:

Each year the County Commissioners provide the Lincoln County Fair and within that the Live-stock Sale Committee provides a 4-H/FFA Livestock Sale for members who exhibit and qualify to sell their respective animals at the fair. Generating buyer support is a great way for members to help make the sale successful for everyone. Oftentimes buyers will come to specifically bid on a member's project if they have been asked or know the member on a business or personal level. Spend some time talking to potential buyers about the sale and the great benefits of buying member raised animals.

Who to Ask to the Sale:

- 1) Family (grandparents, aunts, uncles, cousins, etc.)
- 2) Local businesses in the community in which you live and nearby. (all Business types including agriculture, restaurants, insurance offices, hardware, flower shops, etc.)
- 3) Individuals (neighbors, parent's co-workers, acquaintances, and friends).
- *Reminder ->Respect "No soliciting" signs; which means the business or individual is not interested in buyer solicitations.

Safety Tips When Out Talking to Potential Buyers (Individuals or Businesses):

- -Never enter someone's home; always talk to them on the porch or step.
- -Never go out alone. Always go in pairs or preferably with adults (even if they wait in the vehicle).
- -If out walking->wear bright and visible clothing, obey traffic laws, watch for motorists, and be aware of others out walking.
- -Avoid carrying cash, purses, or large bags.
- -Let someone know of your plan and exactly which locations you will be stopping at.
- -If you are unsure about the safety or security of an individual home or business->>do not enter.

<u>Information for Contact Sheet/Invitation to Leave with the Potential Buyer:</u>

- -First and last name and a phone number (parent number preferable).
- -General information about your involvement in 4-H/FFA (club/school name, county, how many years involved, what projects you take, why you like it, skills learned, etc.).
- -General information about the sale and personal invite with your signature to attend.

Supplies: Ingredients (quantity varies on number served):

-Plate and bowls -Toast

-Cutting board -Strawberries or raspberries

-Spreading and cutting knives -Blueberries

Steps: -Cream cheese

- -Cut up strawberries or raspberries into thin slices
- -Spread cream cheese over each slice of bread
- -Add blueberries to the top left corner of each slice and add strawberries-layered in rows with white spacing to represent the flag pattern.

- Poultry State Fair Nomination Forms are due no later than July 14th to the extension office for signature and mailing. Contact the office for a form. -Check out the Colorado State Fair website for complete information including DNA & show entries @ coloradostatefair.com/livestock/.
- Modified State Shoot Entries and fees are due July 21 to the office. Members must have met all requirements to register for state. Please provide the class type and discipline shooting in and bring or send in fees to the office. The state rule book and class type information is available at co4h.colostate.edu/program-areas/shooting-sports/. (Cost is \$20/per individual + (\$5/class for rifle or archery or \$15/class shotgun). Modified state shoot Dates-August 21-rifle; August 22-Archery; September 3-Shotgun (Jr.); September 4-Shotgun (Sr.).
- **4-H Livestock Showmanship Workshop** for Lincoln County is July 21st at 6:00pm. RSVP to the office by July 19th.
- **4-H Livestock Fitting Workshop** for Lincoln County is July 22nd at 6:00pm. RSVP to the office by July 19th.
- Horse Levels Testing- Members interested in certain fair classes need to review the fairbook for current levels testing requirements. Contact the office for more information. Levels testing study guides are available at: ces/.
- 4-H Club & Foundation Chartering documents must be submitted to the office no later than August 23rd.
- ◆ Home Preservation (Canning) Workshops will be offered August 25th (Hugo) & 28th (Burlington). The workshops are open to all youth 12+ and adults. Cost is \$35 for the day or \$25 for each workshop. Registration is due by August 18th. Basics 101 & Water Bath Canning will run from 8:30-11:30am and Pressure Canning from 1:00-4:00pm. - -Display Boards, Record Book Covers, and Clothing Tags are available if a member needs one (you may utilize a non-green record book cover or purchase a display board elsewhere as long as it meets the size requirements). Please plan ahead on picking any of those items up from the office to ensure availability for pickup and quantity desired. A reminder that we can only accept checks or cash.
- -Record Books Covers-\$3.50ea
 - -Display Boards-\$3.00ea
 - -Clothing Tags- \$3.00 ea.
- -Fair Royalty Try-Out's are July 31. Application packets can be obtained from the extension office and must be turned in by July 26.
- -Fashion Revue (August 7) of Fair (Club Rotation-Walk's Camp)- Duties include: setting up chairs in the Events Building; decorations for the Fashion Revue section of the building; setting up the sound system and podium; providing members to announce participants and read narratives; and cleanup.
- -Fashion Revue– The top 3 senior 4-H age members are eligible to attend the state Fashion Revue. You must notify extension staff directly after the contest and pay the registration fee (\$45) and submit a digital photo of you in your outfit and narration on that Saturday of the Revue. Go to the Colorado 4-H State Fair Resources page for more information and dates on the contest @ co4h.colostate.edu/program-areas/state-fair-information/.
- -The Beef Ultrasound Opportunity will be on Friday (August 13th). Members that wish to participate will need to sign up during beef weigh-in at fair and bring \$20/head for payment.
- -All members need to be aware of weight minimum and maximums on animals for showing purposes and regarding the livestock sale under "4-H/FFA Livestock & Sale Rules" in the fairbook. Also be aware of information regarding extra animals being sold on the floor, sale consignment deadlines and other requirements. Pigs over *325 lbs. will not be allowed to sell this year.
- -Refer to each livestock division on release of non-sale/non-round robin animals during the week of fair. All animals not going through the sale must be removed from the fairgrounds no later than 8:30am on Saturday.
- -Livestock Record Books for Lincoln County are available for download @ lincoln.colostate.edu/4-h-projects-record-books/. Lincoln County 4-H is not utilizing the Colorado State 4-H livestock project record books; but modified county ones. Livestock record books must be turned in by August 31 to the office for project completion.

Fair & 4-H Project Related (cont.)

-General Project Record Books are available on the Colorado 4-H website @ co4h.colostate.edu/program-areas/colorado-4-h-project-information/. Please notice that the site has been updated from last year and you can either click on each area to find the specific record book or download the entire project record book file at the bottom of the page. You can also view general exhibit score sheets at co4h.colostate.edu/program-areas/state-fair-information/score-sheets/. The county fairbook will give you specific guidelines about what is required to complete your project or display board for each class and unit.

-Class Premiums earned for 4-H/FFA & Open Class projects will be mailed out as a check similar to last year. (Fair premiums will no longer be given out as a voucher on Saturday of fair).

-General exhibit 4-H projects that *receive a first in their class* will be eligible to go to state fair. Please check your exhibit at fair for more information about when to drop your project off at the Extension office to go to state fair and for return project pick up. Notify the superintendent during project check-out on Saturday if you intend to send your project to state fair. Continue to watch for additional fair updates as they become available.

-Members are not required to exhibit their projects (livestock or general) at county fair for general 4-H project completion. However general projects must participate in county fair interview judging on August 7 for consideration for state fair qualification. If you do not intend to exhibit at county fair, please let the office know as soon as possible.

- Club Member in Good Standing Forms are due by August 31 to the office.
- County 4-H Award Nominations are due September 1 to the office. Consider nominating someone for one of the awards: Outstanding 4-H'er, Outstanding Volunteer, Partner in Success, Hall of Fame and the Gwendal Leonard Hard Luck award. Nomination forms are available under "awards" at lincoln.extension.colostate.edu/4-h-forms-applications/.
- Youth Grow & Give (Produce) Challenge runs though September 30th. Grow a garden this summer and keep track of produce that you can donate to local food pantries in the county and be entered to win prizes!
