# FAIR: HORSE & DOG ID'S-> 4H ONLINE

For members interested in showing animals at state fair, the deadline to enter Animal ID's for (Horse and Dog is May 1) in 4H Online.

The Lincoln County Fair Deadline is July 1 (Horse & Dog).

We encourage all members to enter ID's by the May 1 deadline as the system will lock for members to enter information directly.

#### General Instructions:

- -Log in to 4H Online
- -Click "View" next to member's name wanting to add an animal ID to
- -Select "Animals" from the left side of the page
- -Click "Add an Animal"
- -Select animal type and start filling in information for that dog or horse. Clear and complete photos of your animal are required for both. Vaccination records are required for dogs. Be sure to accurately and completely add information. If your dog is not registered, put any combination of numbers to bypass the field. Remember that to show an animal at fair it must be ID'd by the deadline.



# FAIR: 4-H GENERAL PROJECT JUDGING

Per Fairboard rule changes: There is now a potential option for kids exhibiting general 4-h projects to do a zoom interview for fair under the following conditions:

- 1) Parent/child must call and get on the Fairboard Agenda for the July meeting.
- 2) The child and parent must both show up to the fairboard meeting in person in July to explain why they cannot attend fair in-person and need a zoom interview.
- 3) The fairboard will review and approve zoom interviews on an individual basis.
- 4) No special allowances will be made in the scheduling of the zoom interview on general 4-H project judging day. The child must make themselves available whenever they are on the schedule during the day. The child/parent must provide their own technology to participate in the zoom interview.

#### ATTENTION: HIGHLY PATHOGENIC AVIAN INFLUENZA

Avian influenza (AI) is caused by an influenza type A virus which can infect poultry (such as chickens, turkeys, pheasants, quail, domestic ducks, geese, and guinea fowl) and wild birds (especially waterfowl). Highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) virus strains are extremely infectious, often fatal to chickens and turkeys, and can spread rapidly from flock-to-flock.

With the recent detections (since February 2022) of the Eurasian H5 strain of highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) in wild birds and domestic poultry in the United States, bird owners should review their biosecurity practices and stay vigilant to protect poultry and pet birds from this disease.

#### How is the disease transmitted?

Foot traffic • Secretions from the bird • Contact with infected droppings • Movement of sick birds • Contaminated clothing and equipment

Poultry with HPAI do not survive the illness. Vaccines for HPAI are not readily available.

#### Signs of Avian Influenza

- Extreme depression
- Difficulty breathing
- Decrease in feed or water intake
- Swelling or purple discoloration of head, eyelids, comb, wattle, and hocks
- Decrease in egg production
- Sudden unexplained death

### **Protect your small flock from Avian Influenza**

The United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) has expanded its <u>Defend the Flock</u> program to educate all poultry growers about best practices in biosecurity. # ANIMAL INFORMATION CORNER: BEEF EXHIBI-TORS (BRAND INSPECTION REMINDER)





# ATTENTION ALL LINCOLN COUNTY LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS

As of 2024, all beef that will be in the market show and sold at the Lincoln County Fair will be required to have a brand inspection (which is a legal bill of sale) in the exhibitor's name. There will be no more "home raised" animals cleared unless the exhibitor is the legal owner of the brand that the animal is wearing. If the animal does not have a brand it must still have a brand inspection in the exhibitors name. As I love to see local ranch raised calves in the show that are wearing a family brand, we must do a change of ownership (brand inspection) from the person selling (gifting) the animal to the exhibitor. Reference Colorado State Statute C.R.S. 35-53-105 (1)-(3) - Failure to Obtain Brand Inspection Prior to Shipment. Please bring your brand inspection with you to weigh in each year. I will mark a new tag number on your certificate. Each August at the fair when you consign your animal to sell, I will need to collect your certificate so please also bring your brand inspection paperwork. If you do not have a brand inspection done by the time the livestock sale starts the money will be held until you get the brand inspection done. Reference Colorado State Statute C.R.S. 35-54-105 (1) - Sale of Livestock Without a Bill of Sale.

If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me at 719-924-3548 or 719-440-1387. Again this will be a requirement starting in the year 2024.

#### **HEAD-> SMART GOALS**

As you work on your 4-H projects for the year, don't forget the goals you set in the fall or winter to help you achieve success in your project and make it more manageable. Goals should be SMART in that they are specific, measurable, achievable, relevant, and time bound. A checklist of your timeline to achieve your goals will make them more manageable. Don't forget to ask for help with your goals and have someone help hold you accountable to complete your goals on time and make the year's project more enjoyable and successful.

### **HEART->** Orphanage Help

### **HEALTH->** Eyeglass Sanitation

We often hear about washing our hands properly especially during cold and flu season. What we don't hear much about is how germs, infections, etc. can be spread through our eyeglasses. Those that wear glasses or safety glasses often take their spectacles off during the course of the day or during their work. Good handwashing translates into clean hands. However we get busy working and begin picking up other items that may not be as clean and then often touch or take off our glasses. The transfer of germs can occur and make us more susceptible to getting pink eye or becoming sick or transferring those germs to someone else. Sanitation using disinfectants is a good practice when cleaning your glass lenses; at least once a day.
