## We want to welcome our new and returning 4-H members and families! The following are some tips and reminders for the 4-H year.

- Each member must complete a demonstration, community service project, and complete at least one 4-H project each year to meet minimum county 4-H requirements. Projects (general and livestock) may be publicly exhibited at the county fair; but this is not required for project completion. Some projects have additional requirements, costs, and/or meetings. Contact your club leader for additional individual club requirements as well.
- 4-H information, events, and updates will come out through the newsletter and email (information goes to the primary email listed in 4H Online). \*Please make sure that emails are not getting stuck in your "spam or junk" folders. Additional information will be posted about other events as well on the *Lincoln County Colorado Extension* Facebook page. Plan accordingly so that important deadlines or requirements at the club and county level are not missed.
- All events subject to change or cancellation due to public health concerns, weather, cost, lack of attendance or closure due to maximum attendance, lack of volunteers, etc.. 4H Online is coordinated through the state and thus many additional events will show up in the registration section in 4H Online than may be applicable to our county members.
- Start on your projects and record books before school is out, so that you may ask questions ٠ and get help to complete your projects on time. Check out the Colorado 4-H website to learn more about the projects offered, what they entail, where to order manuals from and the genproject record books at: co4h.colostate.edu/program-areas/colorado-4-h-projecteral information/. - All deadlines and forms are due on the day stated or previous Friday if date is a holiday or weekend by 4:00pm (close of business). Items faxed, mailed, or dropped in the backdoor after that date/time are considered late. When there is an error in the day of the week and date please reach out for clarification in advance and use the earlier date as the deadline if unsure.
- State (only) deadline is May 1 to enter ID's in 4H Online for dog, horse and cat projects. County deadlines for entries into 4H online will be early summer.
- Check the newsletter and fair website for fair related entry due dates and information.

### WELCOME 4-H MEMBERS & GENERAL REMINDERS

Deadlines: \*\*Note Changes

\*\*March 1 (Date Change)-Project add/drop <u>March 1</u>-Hunter's safety must be completed for all members enrolled in shooting sports that will be participating in live fire activities.

<u>March 2-</u>Market Beef Tagging (Mandatory) & Weigh-In <u>April 1</u>-Meat Quality Assurance Training (MQA) Training Requirements– 1x-As a new member or first year taking a livestock project.

1x-When the member turns 4-H age of 10.

1x-When the member turns 4-H age of 14. \*FFA members must attend their first livestock project year when showing in FFA.

<u>\*\*May 4–</u> Market Sheep/ Goat/Swine) Tagging & Weigh-In

<u>July 1– Market Poultry</u> must have leg bands attached and a nomination form submitted (bands available at the office). <u>Market Rabbits</u> must be tattooed and a nomination form submitted.

<u>Other Fair Related</u>-Check the new fairbook in the spring for information, entry and deadline requirements. **Project Books/Manuals & Updated Information:** Families will need to order project books/manuals directly from the supplier. Go to Colorado 4-H @ <u>co4h.colostate.edu/program-areas/</u><u>colorado-4-h-project-information/</u> and then click on "publication order form" to see where to download or order.

\*Check for updated publications including for your project. Not all projects require a manual.

Utilize the general project score sheets @ <u>co4h.colostate.edu/</u> <u>state-fair-information/score-sheets/</u> to determine if a manual is required for the project. Examples of manuals are available for browsing at the office.

## FAIR RELATED: BEEF EXHIBITORS (BRAND INSPECTION MANDATORY CHANGES)

\*Exhibitors must read through and comply with updated requirements for participation at weighin, fair, and general ownership regarding brand inspections on beef cattle. This is not optional for paperwork to be done at a later date. Please schedule time well in advance of beef weigh-in to ensure you have proper ownership papers on your beef animals and can bring them to weigh-in. Contact the brand inspector for more information. This includes purchased & home-raised (family).

**Beef Weigh-In –March 2 (8:00-10:00am) @ Meier Feedlot** (48750 Hwy 40/287 Limon, CO)-located part-way between Limon and Hugo across the railroad tracks on the west side of the highway. Brand/Ownership papers are required to be brought to weigh-in. You must designate which animal belongs to which kid including family animals at the time of weigh-in, please be prepared.

#### ATTENTION ALL LINCOLN COUNTY LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS

As of 2024, all beef that will be in the market show and sold at the Lincoln County Fair will be required to have a brand inspection (which is a legal bill of sale) in the exhibitor's name. There will be no more "home raised" animals cleared unless the exhibitor is the legal owner of the brand that the animal is wearing. If the animal does not have a brand it must still have a brand inspection in the exhibitors name. As I love to see local ranch raised calves in the show that are wearing a family brand, we must do a change of ownership (brand inspection) from the person selling (gifting) the animal to the exhibitor. Reference Colorado State Statute C.R.S. 35-53-105 (1)-(3) - Failure to Obtain Brand Inspection Prior to Shipment. Please bring your brand inspection with you to weigh in each year. I will mark a new tag number on your certificate. Each August at the fair when you consign your animal to sell, I will need to collect your certificate so please also bring your brand inspection paperwork. If you do not have a brand inspection done by the time the livestock sale starts the money will be held until you get the brand inspection done. Reference Colorado State Statute C.R.S. 35-54-105 (1) - Sale of Livestock Without a Bill of Sale.

If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me at 719-924-3548 or 719-440-1387. Again this will be a requirement starting in the year 2024.

### FAIR RELATED: UPDATES (Cont.)

From the Lincoln County Livestock Sale Committee "To keep Lincoln County's state identification method standard across all species, we will be implementing county wide tags for all market livestock exhibited at the Lincoln County Fair. To accommodate this and the desire for our youth to be able to participate in the rate of gain class for swine, sheep, goats, and beef, we will be hosting a county weigh in date on Saturday, May 4<sup>th</sup> from 8AM to 11AM for sheep, goat, and swine. If a family does not wish to participate in the rate of gain class, they will still be responsible for attending the weigh-in to get the county identification tags in their animals. We know that there will be conflicts with other events, so please utilize your 4-H family to get your show animals tagged. If you have any questions, please contact Emily Baylie or John Thompson."

Market Sheep/Goat/Swine (2024 Change for Weigh-in & Tagging)

-All Sheep, goats, and swine will be required to get tagged on Saturday, May 4th (8:00-11:00am) & weighed (if participating in the rate of gain contests). This replaces the nomination process and forms utilized the past couple of years. Animals do not have to get off the trailer to be weighed, but they do have to be tagged that day to be eligible for entry at fair.

- <u>Rate of Gain Contests</u> will be available for (Beef, Sheep, Goat, and Swine) in 2024. Members must have their animal weighed in at the respective Tagging/Weigh-In date and submit class entry on their fair entry form to be eligible for the contests.
- <u>Sheep (Market Class Addition</u>)->Miniature Sheep (Weight range 60-99 lbs.). Declare at Tagging.

### SHOOTING SPORTS PROJECT INFORMATION:

<u>Shooting Sports Forms Required (Due January 31)</u>: Forms are available online at <u>lin-coln.extension.colostate.edu/programs/4-h/shooting-sports/</u>.

1) 4-H Shootings Sports Project Requirements & Signature Form

2) 4-H Shooting Sports Permission to Participate/Liability Release Form

\*The requirements for minimum project completion and requirements to attend the state shoot are both outlined on the "4-H Shooting Sports Project Requirements & Signature" form. \*Shooting disciplines offered will be subject to certified instructor availability. All participants are required to provide their own ammunition/arrows and safety equipment at shoots.

<u>Shooting Sports Fees Due:</u> <u>\$35/per shooting sports discipline</u> enrolled in is due by January 31 (ex. enrollment in shotgun and rifle would equal a fee total of \$70). This is in addition the member enrollment fee. A Late Fee of \$10.00 applies after January 31. Fees are payable to the Extension Office.

<u>Safety Meetings</u>- \*New project members must attend both safety meetings their first year. Returning members only need to attend one safety meeting. \*Members may not add the shooting project once the 1st safety meeting has passed to participate in range activities.

### (Dates: February 20th @ 6:30pm & February 27th @ 6:30pm @ Lincoln County Fairgrounds.)

<u>Hunter's Safety Certification Due March 1</u>: This must be completed by this date to participate in live fire range activities throughout the year. CPW is offering a class in February in Limon. <u>Practice Shoots and Scored Shoots-</u> All shoots will be held at the Limon gun range. Practice and scored shoots will be scheduled for the late spring and summer.

### STATE FAIR: GENERAL INFORMATION & SHOWING

The Colorado State Fair is August 22– September 2 in Pueblo, Colorado. The state fair provides a number of opportunities for 4-H and FFA members as well as the general public. Opportunities and general events include, but are not limited to: Horse, Livestock, & Small Animal Shows; Concerts & Other Specialty Events; Various Contests; Rodeos; Home & Garden Show; and Vendors.

\*If you plan on exhibiting 4-H/FFA animals at the state fair, be sure to read through their site regarding nominations, DNA requirements, and entries information. Plan well in advance to receive and send DNA kits and obtain form signatures. *This also includes securing a Colorado Premise ID Number as well.* 

-Beef Nomination Forms are due to the office for signature no later than April 1.

-Sheep, Goat, & Swine Nomination Forms are due to the office for signature no later than June 1. \*Plan accordingly to receive forms on the correct paper.

\*4-H members may have the opportunity to exhibit indoor general projects at the state fair by qualifying at the local county fair . Contact the office for more information.

## MEAT QUALITY ASSURANCE (MQA)

Meat Quality Assurance Training for 4-H/FFA members consists of walk-through learning stations and a test. The training is required for all members who are enrolled in livestock projects.

Lincoln County 4-H & FFA Members will be required to complete MQA as follows:

1x-First year taking a livestock project

1x-When the member turns 4-H age of 10

1x-When the member turns 4-H age of 14. \*FFA members must attend as well their first livestock project year when showing in FFA.

#### Lincoln County MQA Date: April 1-> 4-7:00pm @ Lincoln County Fairgrounds

\*If you cannot make the county date you will need to contact the office in advance for a listing of other county trainings that you may attend to complete your requirement. We need to notify other counties before you show up at their MQA training. Dates for other MQA trainings start as early as March in our part of the state.

No EXCEPTIONS. Contact your local brand inspector for any questions regarding transfers including within your family (i.e. home-raised).

## ACTIVITY PAGE: DO I KNOW THE BASICS?

When something goes wrong; what you know about yourself, others, and your surroundings can help emergency personnel assist you more quickly and more effectively. To help stay safe; work with your parents to see if you know some of the basics and go through some tips to be prepared.

#### What I need to know when I call 9-1-1:

-Try to stay calm and speak loud and clear.

-Give them your full name.

-Give them a physical address of your location or descriptors of your location (i.e. street signs, colors, buildings, etc.) as best you can.

-Try to give as much information as you can about what's going on.

-Answer all question they have as best you can and don't hang-up or leave until they tell you to.

### \*If you are lost or need help while out in public:

-Go to a nearby store or business if out on the street or road.

-Look for emergency signal signs or emblems on the street or in buildings for directions.

-Go to the front desk or cash register of a store.

-Look for security or emergency personnel in establishments. What's my first and last name?

How old am I?

What is my physical home address?

What are my parents or guardians first and last names?

What are my parents or guardians phone numbers?

Who else should we call and what's their phone number if my parents are not available?

Do I have any allergies, medical or sensory conditions? Do I know my blood type?

Is there anything else important that emergency people may need to know about me:

### Tips to Help be Prepared:

-Put a child identification and parent contact card in backpacks and luggage bags.

-Practice reciting important personal identification information with your parents and siblings.

-When out and about learn to read traffic signs and begin recognizing identifying marks (such as landscapes and buildings). Also learn what hazard and safety symbols mean as well.

-Practice finding locations using addresses with written and electronic directions. Learn where to look for help if you are lost or don't know where you are going.

-Know how to find your home and a secondary "Safe" location (ex. Grandma's house or your friend john's house). \*Know how to dial 9-1-1 (if you are lost or hurt or someone needs help).

#### HEAD-> Your Local Dashboard

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) provides access to states and counties to allow producers to access information. This information can be searched at the state and/ or county level to be more relevant to your local operation. Data information includes cattle and commodity prices, weather data, historical data, and USDA events coming up. It also provides contact information for your local service centers and state offices. This is a great chance to explore data and resources on the <u>farmers.gov</u> website and also sign up for updates.
