


FAIR RULES AND REGULATIONS

I. RODEO AND TRACK EVENTS

1. The Officers of the Association will see that these rules are strictly enforced.
2. The management reserves the right to make any necessary changes.
3. The management assumes no responsibility for injuries to contestants.
4. The County will not assume any liability for injuries to persons who violate the rules of the grounds. Spectators are prohibited from crossing the track during any event. We respectfully ask the cooperation of the attendants in enforcing this rule and thus preventing accidents.
5. **TRACK EVENTS** Any participant lodging a protest must first deposit \$25.00 cash or certified check with the Secretary of the Lincoln County Fair. Thus, sum will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. Protests must be signed by the protestant and will be received only on the day of judging. All protests must be referred to the Judges of the particular event or division.
6. The management assumes no responsibility for accidents or injury to contestants or stock, and each participant, by the act of participation, waives all claims against the management for any injuries they or their stock sustain. In the event that an animal dies, the owners are responsible for the disposal of the animal. Otherwise, they will be charged a minimum fee of \$125.00 for the removal and disposal of the animal.
7. The management reserves the right to withdraw any contestant's name and entry for violation of any of the rules of the show or judges. All contestants to give assistance when requested to do so by officials of rodeo.
8. At this contest the management proposes to run a speedy program and each contestant is required to lend assistance in the matter of keeping the program moving and up to the standards set by the management.
9. All contests must have at least three contestants to start unless otherwise specified. Entrance fee on all contests, payable when entrance in contest is made. All entrance fees added to purse.
10. All autos must be parked in space reserved for parking. This will be enforced, no exception. Parking will be directed by police. No charge for parking. Contestants and exhibitors' vehicles will absolutely not be permitted to park in front of box stalls except while loading or unloading. This will be strictly enforced.
11. Contest program subject to change at the discretion of Fair Management.
12. Lincoln County will not be responsible for any accidents.

II. STALLS AND PENS

1. Stalls will be assigned by the Superintendent; there will be no exceptions.

2. No private stalls or pens will be allowed. All exhibitors must use the county-owned stalls assigned to them.
 3. No exhibitor may use another stall for storage, unless permission is granted by the Superintendent and the Fair Management together.
 4. Two animals of the same species will be assigned to be stalled together. 4-H/FFA members may bring their own separation panels if needed.
 5. Absolutely no straw for bedding in stalls. Wood chips and peat moss may be used in stalls.
 6. All stalls must be cleaned. If stalls do not meet superintendents' approval upon inspection, an attempt to contact an exhibitor will be made. If there is no response or no change to the pen's cleanliness, the exhibitor's premium monies will be withheld.

III. CONCESSIONS AND PRIVILEGES

1. Permits in this department are issued only by the Fair Manager.
2. The Fair Manager invites proposals for concessions and will be pleased to give information to all interested parties.
3. For reasons, satisfactory to himself, the Fair Manager shall reserve the right to cancel at any time all contracts made with concessionaires.
4. Each concessionaire must confine himself to the place assigned to him. Failure to do so will subject him to forfeiture without reimbursement.

IV. FAIR PURCHASES

All purchases must have prior approval by Fair Manager.

V. CAMPERS & UTILITY VEHICLES

1. Generators turned off between 10 PM and 6 AM
2. Only Fair Staff will be authorized to use utility vehicles on the grounds. Ex: ATV's, Golf Carts, Gators, etc.
