

FAMILY & CONSUMER: PAYING DOWN DEBT IS A FORM OF SAVINGS

One penny, two penny, three penny.... Often paying down debt feels like an arduous process that goes on forever. It feels like all we can put down is one penny at a time, so why bother? However, we can change our mindset by thinking about <u>paying down debt</u> as a form of savings.

What do We Mean?

We traditionally think of saving as putting \$5 into our piggy bank or contributing to our retirement account. However, if we shift our mindset on debt, we can start to see that <u>reducing debt is one way we can "save" money</u>. This is because if we have less debt to pay, then those are funds that can be utilized elsewhere.

Most debts or loan payments involve two parts that we refer to as the principal portion and the interest portion. The principal portion is the amount you spent (i.e. credit card purchase of \$25 at Walmart) or took out as a loan (i.e. mortgage loan of \$365,000). Interest is essentially the cost of "borrowing or using" someone else's money.

For example, your monthly <u>credit card</u> statement shows all your purchases for that month and the total or balance owed. However, if you do not pay off your credit card each month then you would not only have the balance originally owed, plus any new month charges, but you also are now accruing interest daily on the loan balance. A mortgage would start with a total amount of principal owed and then require a corresponding interest cost on the loan depending on the length of your loan and what your interest rate is.

Every Penny Counts...



Every penny (literally) that we pay towards the principal balance of our debt reduces the overall loan balance. This in turn also reduces the amount of interest we owe on each additional loan payment after that because the balance keeps getting smaller. The following examples showcase how <u>additional funds paid</u> towards the balance can affect the overall outcome of when <u>loan balances</u> are paid off and the corresponding reduction in interest expense to us the "consumer".

FAMILY & CONSUMER: PAYING DOWN DEBT IS A FORM OF SAVINGS (cont.)

Credit Card Example:

- Balance Owed: \$500
- Payment: Monthly till paid off
- Interest: 18%
- Required Minimum Monthly Payment: \$35
- If we make payments of \$35/month (with no new charges) it will take 17 months to pay off the balance and will cost us \$68 in interest expense.

If we increase our payments to \$50/month (with no new charges) it will take only 11 months to pay off the balance and cost us just \$48 in interest expense.

Mortgage Loan Example:

- Original Loan Balance: \$365,000
- Loan Payments: Monthly for 30 years
- Interest: 4.8%
- Required Monthly Payment: \$1,915/month (includes principal and interest)
- If we add an extra \$20/month to our payment we could pay off the loan in approximately 8 fewer monthly payments and reduce the overall interest expense paid by \$8,613.

If we add an extra \$100/month to our payment we could pay off the loan in approximately 37 fewer monthly payments and reduce the overall interest expense by \$38,583.

Penny Saved...

It might sound silly, but adding just a few pennies, quarters, or dollars extra to your loan balance each month will reduce the overall amount you pay on the loan and reduce the length of the loan over time. Simple changes to one's approach to debt can increase our savings by simply making more than the minimum payment each month (even if only a few pennies more) to pay off debts sooner; examining our spending habits to make sure we are not spending more than we make each month; reducing interest on current loans by consolidating debt or reducing interest rates by working with our lenders; and using that paid off debt payment (i.e. the \$25 payment you were making to the credit card) and turning around and investing or saving that money.

PROJECT RECORD BOOK REMINDERS

Project Books/Manuals & Updated Information: Families will need to order project books/manuals directly from the supplier. Go to Colorado 4-H @ co4h.colostate.edu/program-areas/colorado-4-h-project-information/ and then click on "publication order form" to see where to download or order manuals. *Check for updated publications including *Rocketry Unit 1, Leathercraft (all units), and Horseless Horse. The project list also has, highlighted in yellow, updated project areas in general.* *Contact the county if you are enrolling in the pilot project "Natural Resources" for publication information.

FAIR: HORSE & DOG ID'S-> 4H ONLINE

For members interested in showing animals at state fair, the deadline to enter Animal ID's for (Horse and Dog is May 1) in 4H Online.

The Lincoln County Fair Deadline is July 1 (Horse & Dog).

We encourage all members to enter ID's by the May 1 deadline as the system will lock for members to enter information directly. You must submit your Id's directly to coopext_lincoln@mail.colostate.edu after May 1 as 4H Online will lock).

General Instructions:

- -Log in to 4H Online
- -Click "View" next to member's name wanting to add an animal ID to
- -Select "Animals" from the left side of the page
- -Click "Add an Animal"
- -Select animal type and start filling in information for that dog or horse. Clear and complete photos of your animal are required for both. Vaccination records are required for dogs. Be sure to accurately and completely add information. If your dog is not registered, put any combination of numbers to bypass the field. Remember that to show an animal at fair it must be ID'd by the deadline.

FAIR: RABBIT & POULTRY NOMINATIONS

Market (Rabbits & Poultry) will need to be nominated similar to other livestock species per the sale committee. This form will be due July 1.

The form can be found on the website under "forms and applications" "fair" tab @ <u>lin-coln.extension.colostate.edu/4-h-forms-applications/</u>.

*Rabbits will need to have an identifying tattoo on their ear. Rabbits need to be tattooed by the nomination form deadline. Fresh tattoos at the fair will result in the disqualification of the animal being shown.

*All market poultry must be nominated and have a leg band (with a number) placed on them. Poultry leg bands must be picked up from the Extension Office in time to submit nomination forms. There is a tool available to borrow to apply the leg bands.

Animals do not have to get off the trailer to be weighed, but they do have to be tagged that day to be eligible for entry at fair.

- Shooting Sports- The second spring practice is (Saturday) May 18 at the Limon Gun Range from 7:45am-12:00pm. Individual discipline start times will be emailed out to participants. Please make sure you are purchasing ammunition well ahead of each scheduled shoot to ensure enough rounds. Watch for emails the week of shoots for any changes including cancellations.
- Lincoln County 4-H Fun Day is May 29 at the fairgrounds in Hugo from 8:00am-12:00pm. Registration is due for participation by May 13 so adequate supplies can be ordered. Open to all Lincoln County Youth (8-18).

- Fair Entry Forms-All entry forms for 4-H and FFA will be done online via the Blue Ribbon program, so those forms will be turned in that way and not on paper forms at all. We just got access to Blue Ribbon that was updated. We will have days that 4-H families can come into the office and fill out their online entry forms with help from Kendra in June or to utilize the internet. Families can still fill out the form to make it easier to make entries once in the program, but we will not accept the printed version for entry purposes.
- State Fair Sheep, Goat, Swine Nominations-Members interested in taking animals to state fair will need to notify the office to receive a state fair nomination form and turn it back in no later than June 1. DNA packets must be ordered online @ coloradostatefair.com/livestock/ in time to receive and ship back to state fair by their stated deadlines. An actual entry form must also be submitted to state fair online (this is not the same as the nomination form or DNA packet). Refer to the Colorado State Fair for all policies and deadlines.
- ◆ 4-H/FFA Hoof Trim (Beef & Dairy Cattle) is June 28 at Eastern Colorado Veterinary Services in Limon. The cost is \$40/head. Limited spots available. Vegetable Pita Pizza-Lilly-Young Chefs Recipe Challenge

This is a simple and health recipe for youth of all ages to help with. Youth make sure to work with a parent when getting started and don't forget to wash your hands before and after and wash surfaces as well. This is also a good time to talk about knife safety with youth. Remember a lot vegetables can be cut up with a butter knife or scissors once they have been peeled. Ingredients can be multiplied to match servings needed. This recipe is for one serving.

Supplies:

-Cookie Baking Sheet -Aluminum foil (makes less clean-up work)

-Cooking Spray -Kitchen knives and/or scissors, and spoon

-1tbsp. Basil -1tbsp. Oregano

-1 Pita -1/4 cup Shredded cheese (mozzarella or other)

-2 tbsp. Tomato sauce -5 Black Olives

1/8 Green pepper & yellow pepper ->*or other colors/varieties

Steps:

- -Preheat the oven to 350°. Cover the baking sheet with aluminum foil, and lightly spray with cooking spray
- -Gently scrub and wash all vegetables and herbs (if fresh) and dry on a clean towel. Cup the peppers and olives into 1/4 inch strips or small chunks.
- -Place the pita on the baking sheet and spread tomato sauce over top with a spoon. Spread cheese, peppers, and olives over the pita. Place the pan in the oven and bake for 10-15 minutes.
